

Cape White Cloud Design: Irene Lindörfer

Stockinette stitch





 $4.5 \text{ sts and } 6 \text{ rows} = 10 \times 10 \text{ cm } (4")$

Gauge stockinette stitch with needle 30 mm:

 $3.5 \text{ sts and 4 rows} = 10 \times 10 \text{ cm (4")}$ Stitch counter x 0.45 or 0.35

Row counter x 0.6 or 0.4

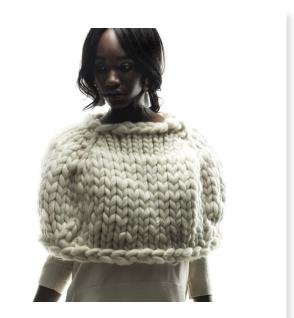
Instructions:

The cape is knitted top-down in rds.

With needle 15 mm (US 19) CO 20 sts and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist. Mark the beg of rd with a piece of contrasting yarn.

Knit stockinette stitch in rds. Rd 1: Mark the 3rd, 10th, 13th and 20th st. Rd 2: MI before and after the marked sts = 28 sts. In every second rd MI before and after the marked sts three times = 52 sts.

Rd 9: Switch to needle 30 mm and continue 7 more rds in st st without any more increases. Rd 16: Decrease by k2tog before and after the marked sts = 44 sts. **Rd 17:** Knit the marked st and the previous st together = 40 sts. **Rd 19:** BO all 40 sts. Break yarn and weave in ends.



Size: Circumference approx. 148 cm (22"), 38 cm (8¾") high

Materials: 1000 g "Miss Wool" (100% merino wool, yardage = 50 m (54 yds.)/ 500 g); color: **Off-White** #980, one 80 cm (32") circular needle 15 mm (US 19) and one 80 cm

4 stitch markers.

(32") circular needle 30 mm.

Stockinette stitch in rds: Knit all sts.

MI: Make one by picking up the horizontal strand between sts and knit into the back of it.
