**Bound** Design: David Kälble Kreatives Projekt AMD Düsseldorf Dipl. Ing. Kirsten Röhrig



#### Size: 34/36



Materials: "XL"(100% merino wool, yardage = 66 m (72 yds.)/100 g), color: 700 g "Ochre" #7490, 4 dpn's 8 mm (US II), one marker, sewing thread in Ochre.

Stockinette stitch in rds: Knit all sts.

## Stockinette stitch



## Gauge in stockinette stitch with needle 8 mm (US II):

II sts and I4 rows = I0 x I0 cm (4")

Stitch counter x I.1

Row counter x I.4

#### Tube:

CO 12 sts on 3 dpn's (= 4 sts on each nd) and join for working in the rd, being careful not to twist. Mark the beg of rd with a contrasting yarn. Knit in stockinette st in rds till the tube measures 3.80 m ( $12\frac{1}{2}$  feet). BO all sts.

Knit a second tube the same as the first.

### Finishing:

Block pieces and leave under wet towels to dry.

The tubes are either crossed or draped around either a dress form or the body and then fixed with sewing threat at the crossing points. Fold the first tube in half and place the middle at the back of the neck. Take both ends to the front and cross them over the bust. Still above the bust, take both ends to back again and cross them at the back, approx. 10 cm (4") over the waist.

Bring the ends along the sides to the front, this time crossing them in the middle below the bust. Now take the ends upwards over the shoulders to the back.

Cross the ends again between the shoulder blades and lead them diagonally back to the first crossing point. There, the ends of the tube are placed at a distance of approx. I5 cm (6") to each other and then sewn to the horizontal tube.

Fold the second tube in half, place it in the middle of the front piece and bring it behind around the upper crossing point of the first tube. Then take both ends to the front and cross them, then lead them over the waist to the back. Cross them again at the mid-back, take both ends to the front, crossing them again below the starting point of the second tube. From this point bring both ends over the shoulders to the back. Take both ends each to the opposite side of the back, weave them with both ends of the first tube.

Then cross both ends of the second tube again at the middle of the back and sew them in place under the ends of the first tube.

To finish off, fix all crossing points with sewing thread.
